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Overview of Opportunity Zones

Investors invest capital gains in qualified projects in zones through Qualified Opportunity Funds (QOFs) and receive federal capital gains tax reductions and/or elimination.



Designed as a tool to spur economic development and job creation in under-resourced communities through tax incentives for investors with recent capital gains.



Program created as part of the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act of 2017.



Opportunity to invest in and have a positive impact on underserved communities.





Incentives for Investors

DEFERRAL of tax on invested capital gains through December 31, 2026.



REDUCTION of capital gains tax on investments held in QOF for at least 5 years ending by December 31, 2026.

Additional reduction on investments held in QOF for at least 7 years ending December 31, 2026.



PERMANENT EXCLUSION from taxable income on capital gains from investment returns of QOF if held in QOF for 10+ years.




Southern Illinois Is Centrally Located


St. Louis is within 100 miles of the center of the region.

Strategic Transportation and Logistics Location


Region is located between the major metro areas of St. Louis, Memphis, and Nashville.

Ideal location for access to major interstate highways (including I-57, I-24, and I-64) and railroads (including the Norfolk Southern, Canadian National, and Union Pacific).

Located on major shipping waterways (Mississippi and Ohio rivers) with city of Cairo at confluence of rivers.

Accessible to airports including:

- Veterans Airport in Marion (limited passenger service to St. Louis and Nashville).
- Southern Illinois Airport in Murphysboro (20 Miles from Marion).
- MidAmerica Airport in Belleville (70 miles from Marion).
- St. Louis Lambert International Airport (100 miles from Marion).
- Nashville International Airport (160 miles from Marion).
- Memphis International Airport (180 miles from Marion).



Colleges and Universities

- Southern Illinois University, Carbondale, is a national public research university with over 14,000 students.
- SIU ranked in top 5 percent of institutions of higher education in US in terms of research expenditure.
- Colleges and Universities support entrepreneurship in growing regional industries through Small Business Development Centers (SBDCs) and other technical assistance programs.
- Local educational institutions offer workforce development training in important regional industries including Hospitality Management, Forestry/Wildlife Management, Culinary Arts, Truck Driving, and Nursing.











Shawnee Hills Wine Trail




Eleven wineries located on 40-mile trail within Shawnee National Forest.

THE ASSETS

 Canadian National Railroad (CN) mainline located within two blocks of park.
- 6 companies currently in the park. Industries include metal plating, agricultural oil processing, synthetic oil mixing and packaging, commercial conveyer belt fabrication, rail-served bulk commodities, and machine shop/tool and die.
- Protected real estate sites for industries with land reserved for expansions.
- Access to high speed internet, municipal utilities, 80,000-pound rated concrete streets, and solar-generated power provided to occupants without cost.
- Located in Tax Increment Financing (TIF) District and Illinois Enterprise Zone.

- Invest in current industrial park occupants or businesses seeking relocation to industrial park designed for real estate protection in a small-town setting.
- Bulk commodity rail-oriented businesses welcome. Industrial park is the only shovel-ready site with complete utilities along the CN between Champaign, IL, and Paducah, KY.



White County: Carmi Downtown Commercial Building




THE ASSETS



THE ASSETS

- Downtown Herrin located on IL State Route 148 and within four miles of a major interstate highway (I-57). Daily traffic count of 11,000 to 14,000 vehicles through Herrin.
- Access to utilities including high-speed fiber optic internet, electric, gas, and water/waste water.
- Access to short line freight rail service to the BNSF railway.
- Scheduled passenger air service available at nearby Veterans Airport (located about five miles from downtown Herrin).
- Located in Tax Increment Financing (TIF) District and Enterprise Zone. Eligible for New Markets Tax Credit (NMTC).

- Invest in current businesses in Herrin or in existing small to midsize businesses looking to relocate to Herrin.
- Commercial buildings available downtown for purchase/renovation. Opportunities for new commercial construction.
